From a very enthusiastic blog called 'Dine and Divine' I glean the following information about St John's: *in exchange for one guinea and a goose, the vicar of the day has been expected to deliver the Wild Beast Sermon on the Sunday nearest to March 18th to commemorate the escape of a member of the Worsley family from a wild beast.* There are various theories about the identity of the wild beast: was it a wild lion in Africa, a wild boar in the New Forest or an escaped lion from a travelling menagerie? I'm curious to know if anyone in the benefice remembers hearing a Lenten sermon, paid for or not by a guinea and a goose, about the wild beast.

Such a thing still happens in London every year. St Katharine Cree, Leadenhall Street, celebrates the miraculous deliverance of Sir John Gayer (1584 -1649), one-time Lord Mayor of London, in the Lion Sermon on 16th October. Apparently Sir John became separated from the caravan while travelling on a trading mission in Arabia – modern-day Syria – and was stalked by a lion. The creature spared him, on account of his devout prayers and vows of charity. When the caravan eventually found Sir John, he was sleeping peacefully, surrounded by the footprints of the lion. THM
